NOTICE OF RACE

The organising authority of the regatta is Lane Cove 12ft Sailing Skiff Club in conjunction with the Cherub Class Owners Association of New South Wales.

The Regatta will be conducted from Friday 2 April 2021 to Sunday 4 April 2021 on the waters of Sydney Harbour, NSW.

1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) 2021 - 2024 and the Australian Sailing regulations.
- 1.2 The class rules and by-laws of the Australian Cherub Class shall apply.
- 1.3 Regulations laid down by the RMS (Maritime).

2. ADVERTISING

- 2.1 Advertising will be as defined by ISAF Regulation 20.
- 2.2 Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organising authority.
- 2.3 The organising authority reserves the right to refuse advertising by a boat or competitor when it is in conflict with an event sponsor or the laws of New South Wales or Australian Governments.

3. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 The regatta is open to all boats of the Australian Cherub class registered with the Cherub National Council of Australia (CNCA) and complying with CNCA rules and restrictions.
- 3.2 All competitors shall comply with World Sailing Eligibility Code and must be financial members of an Australian Sailing affiliated club and the appropriate State Cherub Class Owners Association that is affiliated with the Cherub National Council of Australia.
- 3.3 All competitors shall be current Australian Sailing members.
- 3.4 Once registered, boats may be eligible for the following trophies:

Open:	All entrants
Handicap:	All entrants
Junior:	All skippers under the age of 21 on Friday 2 April 2021

4. ENTRIES AND FEES

- 4.1 Eligible sailors may enter online at TryBooking <https://www.trybooking.com/BPGVB> before Friday 2 April 2021 at 12:00pm.

- 5.2 Five (5) championship races are scheduled to be sailed.
5.3 No more than three (3) races will be sailed on any one day.

6. MEASUREMENTS

- 6.1 Each boat shall comply with the Cherub National Council of Australia's Rules and Restrictions updated September 2014.
6.2 At any time during the regatta, a boat can be instructed by a race committee equipment inspector or measurer to proceed immediately to a designated area for inspection.

7. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 7.1 The sailing instructions will be available on the Cherub website (<http://cherub.org.au/events/>) and at registration.

8. VENUE

- 8.1 The Regatta will be conducted on the waters of Sydney Harbour, NSW.
8.2 Attachment 1 shows the location of the regatta and the approximate location of the racing areas.

9. COURSES

- 9.1 The courses to be sailed will be in accordance with the CNCA constitution.
9.2 Course diagrams, including the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left will be provided in the Sailing Instructions.
9.3 The target race duration will be 45 minutes when two (2) or more races are to be sailed on that day and 80 minutes when one (1) race is to be sailed on that day.

10. PENALTY SYSTEM

- 10.1 RSS Rule 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.
10.2 Any boat that is subject to a protest hearing shall sign the infringement form within the protest time limit.

11. SCORING

- 11.1 Points scoring shall be in accordance with the RRS Low Points System.
11.2 Three (3) races are required to be completed to constitute a series.

12. SAFETY

- 12.1 All competitors shall wear personal flotation devices which are in good condition and are in accordance with the specifications issued or approved by a national authority or standards organisation and branded in the country of origin or manufacture.
12.2 Attention is drawn the following rules:
RSS Rule 1.2 Life-saving Equipment and Personal Flotation Devices which reads: "*Each competitor is individually responsible for wearing a personal flotation device adequate for the conditions.*"
RSS Rule 4 Decision to Race which reads: "*The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone.*"

- 12.3 RSS Rule 41 shall apply when an official safety boat crew assists a boat and/or returns her crews to their boat for safety reasons.
- 12.4 The sail number of a boat which receives outside help will be reported to the race committee with details of the incident. The report may be submitted as evidence during a protest.
13. **SUPPORT BOATS**
- 13.1 Team managers, coaches and other support personnel shall advise the racing authority. Approved Support Boats shall keep at least 100m clear of the course area during racing, except when asked to assist by the race committee. Support boats must be able to communicate on the designated VHF frequency at all times.
14. **RIGHTS TO USE NAME AND LIKENESS**
- 14.1 In participating in an event, a competitor automatically grants to the organising authority and the sponsors of the event, the right in perpetuity, to make, use and show, from time to time and at their discretion, any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or film television and other reproductions of him/her during the period of the competition for the said event in which the competitor participates and in all material related to the said event without compensation.
15. **TECHNOLOGY**
- 15.1 While on the water, a boat shall not use equipment that facilitates live communication with a 3rd party while racing or in sequence by: making radio transmissions or receiving radio transmissions; mobile telephone technology, or; WI-FI and internet based technology, except for equipment provided by the organising authority
16. **PRIZES**
- 16.1 The following trophies will be awarded:

- 16.2 Further prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the organising authority.
17. **DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY**
- 17.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RSS Rule 4: Decision to Race.
- 17.2 The organising authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with, or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
18. **INSURANCE**
- Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$10M AUD or the equivalent. All owners/competitors who have registered online are deemed to have made a declaration that they hold such cover.
19. **CANCELLATION**
- To the extent that the organising authority is prevented from holding the event, or considers it unsafe to hold the event, due to any cause beyond its reasonable control (including but not limited to a natural disaster, fire, flood, accident, war, riot, terrorism, an epidemic, pandemic, law or any government direction or restriction related to the foregoing), then the organising authority reserves the right to cancel the event at its sole discretion. If the organising authority cancels the event then it will refund any entry fees paid by competitors for the event. The organising authority will not be liable for any loss or liability suffered or incurred by competitors as a result of the cancellation of the event pursuant to this clause beyond the refund of entry fees paid by a competitor.
20. **AMENDMENTS**
- Any amendment to this Notice of Race will be posted on the Cherub website (<http://cherub.org.au/events/>)

21. **BOAT STORAGE**

Rigging Space will be available on the premises of Lane Cove 12ft Sailing Skiff Club with extra rigging and trailer parking available at Dunois Reserve. This park is located off Dunois Road, Longueville, and borders Woodford Bay. Any boats will be stored at the owner's own risk.

22. **ACCOMMODATION**

Visitors to Sydney seeking accommodation are encouraged to advise the organising committee.

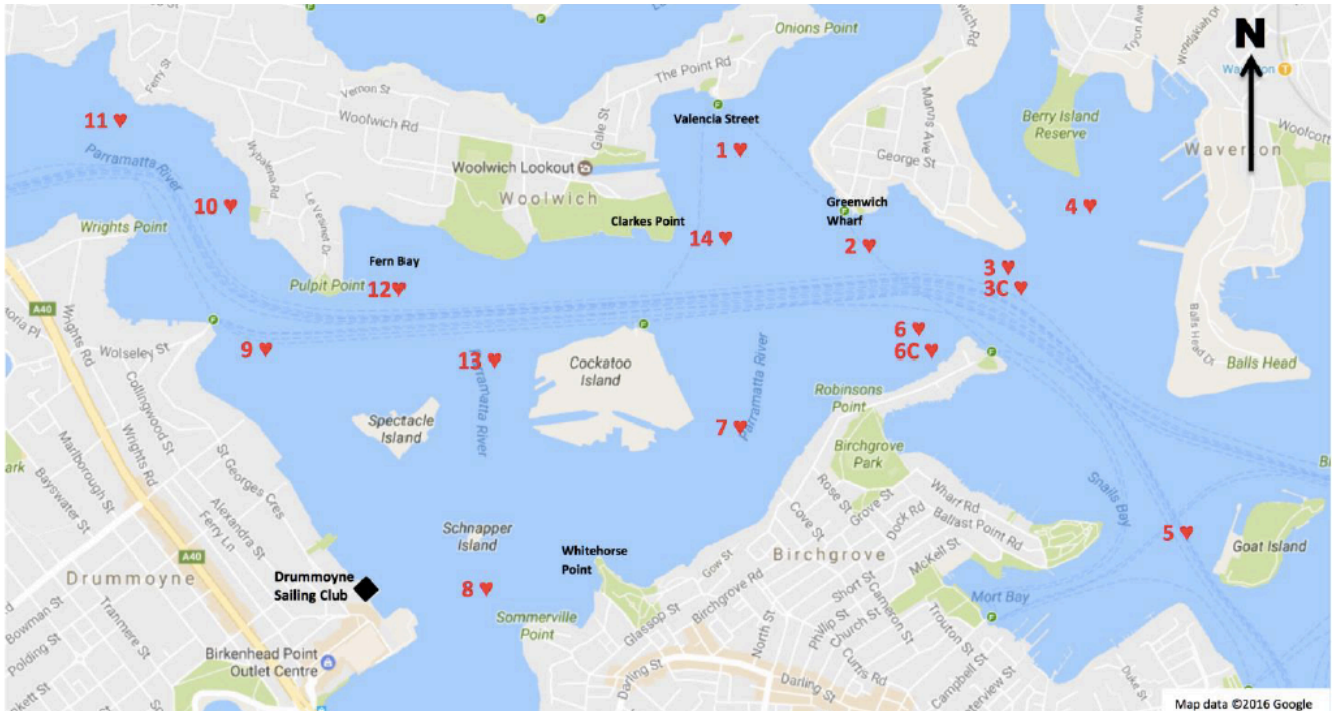
